Acknowledgement of Country



He chewed and growled and rolled around. 'Oh no!' said Uncle Vin.'Look what you found!'






On Tuesday Uncle Vin played with Scruffy in the backyard.

Uncle Vin gasped, 'What a terrible sight!'






On Wednesday Uncle Vin took Scruffy to meet the neighbours in the house next door.

On Thursday Scruffy helped Uncle Vin in the garden.







Scruffy grabbed the hose and shook it in the air. Water sprayed here, and water sprayed there.

He was drenched from head to toe.


On Friday Uncle Vin took Scruffy for a walk in the park.
